
No Sweat Step-by-Step: Best Practices for Using Canvas

I. Modules


- a. Containers for everything from discussions to quizzes to assignments to learning videos.
- b. Allow you to go week-by-week or unit-by-unit in an organized fashion. Let's compare my ELA to my math courses.


II. Naming Conventions Within Modules

b. Choose the names or abbreviations you use.





c. Be consistent. All my modules follow the same pattern so that students know what to expect. Every now and then, I may add something extra, like a discussion, but it won't throw them off if the rest is similar.
